Special Projects

Complementary to the general services of La Maison Bleue, our team of professionals host special projects, which are supported by various partners.

The Gift of Reading

The Literacy Foundation offers books to underprivileged children. As part of the program, La Maison Bleue received over 300 books that were given to families, promoting the love of books for both children and their parents.

HIPPY Québec

HIPPY Québec is a program that provides direct assistance to Maison Bleue families with preschool-aged children at risk (from 3 to 5 years) through weekly home visits by peers who are trained in this area. By participating in HIPPY Québec, we support our families in their child's skill development to prepare them for integration in school. More than a dozen La Maison Bleue families have benefited from a HIPPY-Québec's service this year.

Babysitting

La Fondation de la Visite offers in-home babysitting services to La Maison Bleue families in Côte-des-Neiges who have just had a baby. This foundation also offers starter boxes containing blankets, bonnets, etc.

Horizon 0-5, Projet Constellation

This project seeks to pool and share strategies from the Island of Montreal to reach isolated families with young children.

Projet Contact

In collaboration with the libraries of the City of Montreal, a host reads to parents and their children (under 5 years). These workshops specifically target people from disadvantaged backgrounds, as well as newcomers, in order to foster social integration and provide parents with the desire to read with their children.

“Sac à dos” Program

La Maison Bleue integrated this special program of the librairies of the City of Montreal (within the Contact Project)—families can borrow a backpack filled with books, for a period of two weeks, after which the backpack and books are returned.

Projet NUTRITION

Students in the nursing program of Université du Québec en Outaouais à Saint-Jérôme developed simple tools relating to healthy eating habits and presented two workshops on food safety in our group activity Santé de la famille.

Consultation on health and poverty in relation with diet habits and physical activity

A team of Saines habitudes de vie du secteur Très petit-jeunes of the Agence de Santé et des services sociaux de Montréal and le Groupe de recherche et de formation sur la pauvreté au Québec (GRFPQ) are partners in this process that takes a critical look at our professional practices relating to populations living in poverty. They met with some of our families participating in our group activity Santé de la famille in order to explore and understand the perceptions, the beliefs, the facilitating factors and the barriers regarding the adoption, by young impoverished families, of a healthy diet and a physically active lifestyle.

Projet Découverte du quartier

Students from the Faculty of pharmacy of Université de Montréal came to film a video to present to our clients the resources in Côte-des-Neiges. A simple and concise video is available to our clients to help them find suitable community resources.

Projet Colibri

Funded by the Inclusion and Innovation program and supported by the Eureka! Organization, this project has allowed our clients to create collective works of art. Guided by professional mosaic artist Isabelle Claire Murphy and multimedia artist Chantal Bergeron, participants had the opportunity to learn the art of mosaic and to share their experiences. These works are presented at the Côte-des-Neiges and Parc-Extension Maison Bleue.

Christmas Campaigns

This year, over 400 gifts and food baskets were distributed to families of La Maison Bleue thanks to generous partners: Opération Père Noël, Magasin-Partage, the school of Saint-Germain d’Outremont, Lester B. Pearson High School and many volunteer knitters. We also relied on the The Gazette Fund, a food collection organized by the employees at the SOFITEL Montréal Golden Mile hotel and the help of little elves from Pensionnat de Saint-Nom-de-Marie for a special activity. This year, the second Guignolée de La Maison Bleue was held where the entire team put on its Santa hat!

Espaces pour la vie

A group of children from the Parc-Extension Maison Bleue took advantage of the special activity of “The Great Pumpkin Ball” at the Botanical Garden.

Welcoming Campaign for Syrian Refugees

La Maison Bleue contributed to the collective effort to welcome Syrian refugees by offering services to pregnant women who had just recently arrived.

Voluntary Work

More than 40 volunteers gave their valuable contribution to La Maison Bleue during this year:

We also have several Guardian Angels who, through material gifts, meet the needs of some of our most disadvantaged families. Doing fundraising within their social groups to provide strollers or new winter clothes; sponsoring families over several years so that our little ones may dance, play soccer, learn music and go to camps as their own children would; all this anonymous and unsolicited.

We should also mention the volunteer involvement of many professionals who made a range of services and additional support available for some families:

Assessment and Knowledge Transfer

Research project with the support of Avenir d'enfants

La Maison Bleue is proud of the publication in April 2015, after 3 years of research, of the report entitled “Évaluation de la mise en œuvre, des effets et de la valeur économique de La Maison Bleue” (Dubois N. et al. 2015). In collaboration with partners of the health, academic, community and institutional fields, this research helps address the issues associated with the establishment of a Maison Bleue and its essential features, both from an organizational and clinical perspective. This document was distributed to various partners and used to demonstrate the value of the Maison Bleue model.

The following is a summary of the guidelines that emerged from this research.

- › The “Maison Bleue” model is effective and efficient at helping vulnerable families welcome their baby and support its development.
- › Its intervention model is innovative and replicable, provided the essential criteria for integrity and its link to the public health system are respected.

L’empreinte de La Maison Bleue : fondements et guide de pratiques

Following the publication of this evaluation report, the logical next step is to gather procedures and establish the functioning model and spirit of La Maison Bleue in order to build a thorough inventory of the steps and resources needed to establish a new one. We have been working on producing this document, the publication of which is planned for May 2016. By taking a “screenshot” of what is La Maison Bleue, we set down the foundation that will serve to replicate this model. By describing operational processes for interventions and management as they occur in 2016, this guide will serve to present the Maison Bleue model to potential partners and sponsors, as well as serve as a reference document for administrators, employees and volunteers.

MAVAN Project (Maternal well-being, vulnerability and neurodevelopment)

This study aims to evaluate the effects of the environment and, more specifically, of maternal stress on children's development. La Maison Bleue families are invited to participate in this large-scale research.
